Pre-lesson questions for homework study and review:

- 1. Generally speaking, who are the people we call the founding fathers of our country? (Pages XV-XXXI) Who are the Founding Farthers?
- 1) Signers (55) of the Constitution. 2) Debaters of Ratification Process (66): John Adams (not in Convention) = 121 people + founding mothers, others.
- 2. IDENTIFY SIX OF THE FOUNDERS WHOSE DESCRIPTIONS PARTICULARLY IMPRESSED YOU, AND TELL WHY. (XV- XXIX)
- 1.) Benjamin Franklin. well known to be the greatest philosopher... operations of nature he understands...the very heaves obey him"
- 2.) William Peirce (no comments entire sessions, only wrote, what made them believable)
- 3.) Alexander Hamilton (xx) no skimming surface...sins to the bottom to see the foundation" ~through!
  - 4.) James Madison ablest best informed men at the constitution
- 5.) Gouvenor Morris wittiest man at the convention. "charms, captivates, leads away all the senses of all who hear him" -- also the Preamble's author!
- 6.) William Patterson -- "one whose powers break in upon you and establishes power...great modesty..."looks bespeak talents of no great extent"
  - 7.) George Washington -- "contented with being only a plain citizen"
- 8.) James Wilson -- born in Scotland, accent same, knew "all the political institutions of the world he knows in detail"

[an assembly of the greatest of all possible men where there!] also: John Jay, Samuel Adams, John Hancock, Patrick Henry, Richard Henry Lee, etc.

3. Show statistically how the Constitution elevated the United States to the Wealthiest Nation on Earth. (1) The World's Greatest Success Formula America by 1900 > – less than 1/16 of World's population – less than 1/16 of world's land +producing over 1/2 of goods and services!

- J. Adams "opening of a grand scene and design in providence"

- 12. IN WHAT WAYS DID THE FOUNDING FATHERS DIFFER FROM EACH OTHER? > remarkable unanimity How, then, do we explain their remarkable unanimity in fundamental Beliefs? (10-11) >1)-Culture 2)-Beliefs—read mostly the same books
- 13. What do you think the founders would say today, more than 200 years later, about how well we have preserved the system they gave to us?
