- o first draft did not sell
- o Gouvernor Morris wrote new preamble
- o Included 6 blessings of good government
- o Best learned with sign language

Provision 1

"We the people"

- o All authority belongs to the people
- o People are only safety
- o Education is true corrective of abuses
- o Constitution not adopted by states but by the people, [p 234 col2]

Provision 2

"A More Perfect Union"

- o 50 previous proposals failed
- o Simon Bolivar failed
- o Advantages of Union
  - common defense
  - control internal convulsions
  - regulation of commerce
  - prevent territorial wars in west
  - people will give up some liberty to be united and safe
  - Mission of the Rising Generation

"Equal Justice for All"

- o Unalienable rights protected
- o Innocent until proven guilty
- o Justice:
  - place to complain
  - machinery for a remedy
- o Must have a large union

"Ensure Domestic Tranquility"

- o Law and Order
- o Need division of powers

- "Provide for Common Defense"
- o against external threat [Washington: being prepared for War is surest peace policy.]
- o against internal subversion [Britain, Spain & Indians all threats to peace]
- 6. What right is anticipated in the term "general welfare"?

How has this expression been interpreted both as a grant of federal power and as a restriction on federal power? (244)

Provision 6

"Promote General Welfare"

- o General not special needs [must benefit all– not at all practiced much today! E.g. Fed 'local' disaster proclamations, or, farm pricing support]
- o No private welfare
- o No favoritism
- 7. What right is anticipated by the words "secure the blessings of liberty"? What did the founders say was necessary to the continuation of these blessings? According to Alexis De Tocqueville, what were Americans doing in the Early 1830's to perpetuate our system? (245) [training the youth in schools]

"Secure Blessings of Liberty"

- o Protect future generations
- o Gov to be divided, balanced, limited
- o Maintain a virtuous people [by electing the same]
