Copyrights and Patents

A New Idea

- o Not in Articles
- o Not in the first draft
- o Some states had used
- o Technique to encourage creativity

[a genius idea never beforehand considered in history]

- no funding
- no regulation

[Lifetime of Author plus 50 years]

Is it a Natural right? (P431)

- o (Jefferson Quote)
  - Inventions (ideas)are not property
  - Therefore not a natural right
  - Society may give an exclusive right = vested
  - Thousands of permanent monopolies would be more injurious

Copyrights

- o Exclusive, legal rights
- o Lifetime of Author plus 50 years

- o Classes: a)literary b) music c) drama d) art e) movies f) computer programs
- o Copy sent to Library of Congress [Procedures] HOW DOES ONE OBTAIN A COPYRIGHT? (431-32)

[Give notice, then within 90 days submit to govt offices (copyright or patent) with fee.]

3. TELL THE HISTORY OF <u>PATENTS</u> IN THE UNITED STATES. (432-33)

Patent Law

- o Exclusive for 17 years
- o Must be new, unique, and useful

- o Inventor must tell all details
- o Thomas Edison granted over 1,200 patents
- o FDR opened Patent Office to Soviet Union for free access!

- o Trademarks registered with states or patent office
- 5. Why was Congress given power to create federal courts inferior to the Supreme Court? (433-34)

Provision 92

Congress to establish inferior federal courts

- o Needed in every state [to carry out the laws of the general government]
- o 144 district courts [President nominates/ Congress approves most powerful, influential thing he does while in office.]
- o 9 circuit courts
- o Special courts
  - Court of Claims
  - Court of Customs
  - Court of Tax Appeals
- 6. Why was Congress given power to define and punish felonies committed on the high seas? (434-35)

[Common law is both vague and defective.]

Provision 93

Define and Punish Piracies and Felonies on High Seas

- o On open seas outside any state
- 7. What is the "law of nations?" How have the United Nations and the World Court tried to usurp the authority to punish offenses against international Law? (436)

Provision 94

Define and Punish Offenses Against Laws of Nations

- o Committed by other nations against United States
- o Law of Nations: reason, morality, and custom
- o Many want to turn this function over [to] World Court over U.N.
- o World court controlled by anti-American philosophy
- o Connelley Reservation protects US from jurisdiction of World Court
