No o The Constitution is supreme (constitutional supremacy or the people) o Art 1 Sec 10 has two parts: -What the states cannot do -What the states cannot do without the approval of Congress 2. WHY DID CHARLES PINCKNEY CALL ARTICLE I, SECTION 10, "THE SOUL OF THE CONSTITUTION"? (492) [It kept the states from interfering with the Union, yet gave them power to do their rightful congressional-assigned duties with dignity, 'public honor' and 'private honesty'.] 3. DOES THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT HAVE THE RIGHT TO PREVENT A STATE FROM FORMING AN ALLIANCE OR CONFEDERATION? (492) Provision 121 - No treaty, alliance or confederation. o Crux of the Civil War [made alliances with other states!] o Would wreck union o Question of secession is settled 4. WHY SHOULD NO STATE GRANT LETTERS OF MARQUE AND REPRISAL? (492-93) Provision 122 - No letters of margue and reprisal [the hiring of militias of other countries for their own use]. 5. DESCRIBE THE RESTRICTIONS IMPOSED ON THE STATES WITH REGARD TO THE MONETARY SYSTEM. (493-96) Provision 123 - No state can coin money or emit bills of credit. o Prevented one of the worse problems after the Rev War o Restore confidence of other nations in us (quote, [Charles Pickney]) o Evils of paper money (quotes):-Making it legal breeds vices-Drives gold and silver out of circulation-Destroys property o This clause prohibits "legal tender" bank notes [the clause actually prohibits what Fed Reserve has done!] 6. WHAT DOES THE CONSTITUTION ESTABLISH AS THE REQUIRED BASIS OF THE AMERICAN MONEY SYSTEM? (497) **Provision 124** - Use nothing but gold and silver to pay debts.

7. WHAT WAS THOMAS JEFFERSON'S INGENIOUS IDEA FOR FINANCING AN EMERGENCY

SITUATION IN CASES WHEN PRECIOUS METAL IS NOT AVAILABLE? (498)

o Jefferson's method to provide emergency funds: -issue redeemable paper currency.

-impose a tax to gradually to recover amount of paper issued.

-no inflation after crisis.

8. How have the states been forced to violate the Constitution with regard to the USE OF MONEY? (498) [Through the creation of the 'Federal Reserve Note' - fiat money which is exactly opposite of coining gold and silver and making debts paid only with it.] 9. How are the states restricted concerning Bills OF ATTAINDER AND EX POST FACTO

LAWS? (499) **Provision 125** - No state can pass bill of attainder.

Provision 126 - No state can pass ex post facto laws.

10. WHAT PROTECTION DOES THE CONSTITUTION GIVE PEOPLE WITH REGARD TO EXISTING CONTRACTS? **Provision 127** - No state to impair contracts [between private individuals]. How has this provision been violated? (499-500)

o Violations:

-suspending mortgage payments

-compelling people to take paper money for gold

-telling mortgage companies not to foreclose on homes

11. CAN A STATE GRANT A TITLE OF NOBILITY? (500)

Provision 128 - No title of nobility.

"Without the Consent of Congress"

12. WHAT REQUIREMENT MUST A STATE COMPLY WITH IN ORDER TO ASSESS DUTIES ON IMPORTS OR EXPORTS? (501-2)

Provision 129 - Without the consent of Congress, no duties on imports and exports. o Protects inland states and producers

13. WHAT IS TONNAGE? CAN A STATE IMPOSE A DUTY ON A SHIP'S TONNAGE? (503)

Provision 130 - [With the consent of Congress, states] may recover costs of inspection. **Provision 131** - Without the consent of Congress, no duty on ship's tonnage.

14. CAN THE GOVERNOR OF A STATE BUILD A LARGE STANDING ARMY IN PEACETIME WITHOUT RESTRICTION? (503)

Provision 132 - Without the consent of Congress, no troops or ships of war in peacetime.

15. WHEN CAN A STATE ENTER INTO COMPACTS WITH OTHER STATES?

Provision 133 - Without the consent of Congress, no agreement with another state or nation.

HAS THE VIOLATION OF THIS CLAUSE CAUSED SERIOUS HARM? (504)

o Some agreements are beneficial:

-e.g. Colorado River water to benefit Western States.

-must have Congress approval.

16. WHEN CAN A STATE ENGAGE IN WAR? (504)

Provision 134 - Without the consent of Congress, no war unless invaded or in danger.
