## John's Conclusion (1 John, Rev) (4:1, 16; 5:1,5,10,13; Rev 21:8.—10 instances of believe) TITLE: \_Believing is can be transforming-ly beneficial OR unbelieving can be deceivingly tragic .

- 1. 1John was written **Date**: Probably about A.D. 90
- <u>1Jn\_4:1</u> Beloved, do not **believe** every spirit, but test the spirits, whether they are of God; because many false prophets have gone out into the world.
- 1Jn 4:2-3 By this you know the Spirit of God: Every spirit that confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is of God, (3) and every spirit that does not confess that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is not of God. And this is the *spirit* of the Anti-Christ, which you have heard was coming, and is now already in the world.
- Why are we told 'do not believe every spirit?'
- How does one 'test the spirits?'
- What other information can be observed from the context of v.1?
- Does this verse add to John's warnings [see 1 John 2:15-17] about 'the world?' How?

1Jn 2:15-17 Do not love the **world** or the things in the world. If anyone loves the **world**, the love of the Father is not in him. (16) For all that *is* in the **world** —the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life—is not of the Father but is of the world. (17) And the **world** is passing away, and the lust of it; but he who does the will of God abides forever.

- Why are these verses so powerful in *unmasking the deception of the* **world**?
- Can 'all that *is* in the **world**', the lusts and pride operate separate from each other, or are they intertwined?
