

- a. They considered themselves a commonwealth of freeman.
- b. Every decision and selection of leaders had to be by consensus of the people, preferably by a full consensus, and not just a majority.
- c. Power was dispersed among the people and never allowed to concentrate in any one person or group.
- d. They were organized into small manageable groups where every adult had a voice and a vote.
- e. The system of justice was structured on the basis of severe punishment unless there was ... reparation to the wronged person. There were four crimes against the whole of the people [to be punished] 1 treason 2 cowardice, 3 desertion and 4 homosexuality. These were considered capital offenses [no reparation was acceptable]
