The Reality of the Creator

- A Self-Evident Truth

- Brain talk: -Chance will not create a *watch*. -Universe is a product of Intelligent design! -The atheist is irrational!
- Locke's Formula to know There is a God:
 - 1. I exist, therefore I am. "Cogito ergo sum"
 - 2. I am a something.
 - 3. A something cannot come from a nothing.
 - 4. Must be an all-knowing Something
 - 5. Superior to everything He created
 - 6. Anglo-Saxon for ultimate good is "God"
- 1. Tell why John Locke concluded that an atheist was "irrational." (pages 95-96) John Locke, *Essay Concerning Human Understanding*
- Everyone can know there is a divine Creator
 - 1. Each person knows he exists.
 - 2. Each person knows He is something.
 - 3. Each person knows something could not be produced by a nothing.
 - 4. Whatever brought man and everything into existence also had to do something.
- 5. This *something* according to all the organizing, arranging and ordering apparent would have to be all-knowing to produce the same.
 - 6. This *something* would have to be superior to everything so produced.
- 7. This statement of superiority would make the *something* the ultimate "good" for all that had been produced.
 - 8. In Anglo-Saxon language, the word for supreme or ultimate good is "God."
- 2. Explain the five steps by which. according to Locke, everyone can know there is a divine Creator. (96)

- Because man is cognitive (or reasoning), God must be the same.
- Because man has compassion and love, God must be the same.
- The Creator would have a sense of right and wrong and an equally strong sense of indignation or wrath for violations of the same. Thus a sense of "justice."
- Other attributes of humankind must be shared with his Creator if made 'in His image.'
- sense of humor. artistic abilities all these are gained by observation who is a 'thoughtful person'
- So atheists fail to apply self-reasoning and observation given them by their Creator.
- 3. Describe several attributes of God that Locke said would be easy for man to identify. (Pp.97-98)
- Locke's Attributes of God
 - cognitive (reasoning)
 - 2. compassion and love
 - 3. sense of right and wrong
 - 4. sense of humor
 - 5. great artist
 - 6. hundreds of things if one just thinks about it
- 4. What are the two ways men learn about God's laws? What kinds of truths are made known by each method? (98-99) [Natural Law, Revealed Law]
- William Blackstone
 - 1. Creator "impressed certain principles upon matter from which it can never depart"
 - 2. Will of God expressed in order of universe = natural law
 - 3. All human law depends on natural law
- 5. Were the founding fathers deists? Give examples showing that the founders regarded themselves as being dependent on a living. intelligent, benevolent, caring, and responsible God. (pp. 99-100)
- Nearness of God
 - 1. Deist = God created but then left
 - 2. Founders believed God: was close answered prayer protected them
 - 3. Washington wrote 67 times during war of God's providence
- 6. Of what value were religious convictions to the validity of public oaths? (Pp. 100-101)
- "In God We Trust"
 - 1. No idle gesture
 - 2. Required oath by all public officials
 - 3. Must believe in God to take oath
 - 4. Non-believers not allowed to testify in court
