Without property rights (4 results)

(Just when improvement is done, covetous neighbor would take)

[Nabal's Vineyard & Ahab is a clear biblical example-cpl]

- o Destroy incentive
- o Deprived of fruits of labor
- o Marauding bands forcible take
- o Society on bare subsistence level
- 4. Why is an attack on private property rights actually an attack on life itself?

(171-72) Property is Extension of life

- o Locke: Property is result of life, energy, ingenuity
- o To destroy property is attack on life itself!

Icon illustrations – cultivate a farm – food by hunting – carving a statue – earning wages

- life is projected into that property (Locke quote)

- o At the first gathering of nature
 - (- when you add labor, you add value that is owned by you alone!)
- o What if we own it all in common?
 - -Would need the consent of every person! (quote)

What is sacred?

- o Property or the right to property?
 - -The right to property
- o U.S. Supreme Court (p173) not "of" property.
- o Abraham Lincoln (p174)
 - -Why let people become rich?
 - -To show others they can be

Primary Purpose of Government

- o Protect property
- o Essential to liberty
- o What about transfer payments?

- o Davy Crocket story
 - he was a TX congressman, "Georgetown" burning, money from govt to rebuild, farmer plowing refused support 'Horacio Bunch,' DC apologized for money spent wrongly.
- o No right of government (quote)

[to take taxpayer money and spend it for any unlawful aid or any other support]

How do we care for the poor?

o anybody but the federal government

Grover Cleveland (democrat) - vetoed aid bill (p177)

- -"though the people support the government, the government should not support the people"
- o Poor helped by friendliness and charity.

"kindly sentiment which strengthens bonds" – GC [individuals, charities, corporations, communities, etc. giving voluntarily]
