 - -advanced studies prepare for Harvard [college]
- Illegal not to have a school! (quote)

- 1 locally supported2 parent directed
- 3 professionally assisted

- France only 500,000 out of 24 million could read and write [2% only!]

American Literacy

- very little formal education
- basics taught reading, writing, arithmetic
- mostly Self-learning in colonies
- Franklin, Washington

Alexis de Toqueville

- American most enlightened in world (quote)
- not a single district in ignorance

- wilderness people educated (quote) [most in rustic log houses kept primitive]
 - -dress and speaks well
 - -brings Bible, axe, newspapers
 - -exceeds any place in France

- All Americans even children know answers [Catechism of Constitution, 1828]

- Daniel Webster 1843
 - -Americans speak better English than in England
