Two Parts of Manifest Destiny

o Nation would stretch from sea to sea

[orig meant merely 'from sea to shining sea' / (implies limits within this continent)] Foundation of God's Kingdom on earth (quote) [Exodus from Europe]

- guided by God to America
- mission like children of Israel
- 2. CAN YOU PROVIDE EVIDENCE THAT THE FOUNDERS REGARDED THEMSELVES AND THEIR COUNTRYMEN AS MASTER SERVANTS RATHER THAN A MASTER RACE? (306-7) o Design in Providence (J Adams quote) Break down slavery world-wide

- o Adams: American Failure is treason against world
- 4. What were John Jay's reasons for believing that America had been the recipient of God's blessings? (307-8)

John Jay [The Jay Treaty = end of G. Wash's 2nd term – removal of English troops in what is now Canada- 'Northern Border']

America: [was not detached and distant territories, e.g. India, Hong Kong]

- connected, fertile land
- variety of soils [AZ=alkaline, Northern= acidic]
- innumerable streams [rivers navigated shipping perfectly]
- navigable waters
- most noble rivers
 - -easy transportation

 - united
 - same ancestors
